Founding Daughters

Eugenia Washington was born on June 24, 1840, near Charlestown in what is now West Virginia. She was the daughter of William Temple Washington and Margaret Calhoun Fletcher, a great niece of Senator John C. Calhoun of South Carolina. In 1859, when she was nineteen years old, her father moved the family to Falmouth, Virginia, just north of Fredericksburg. Her mother died near this time and her father was disabled and relied on his daughter to care for him.

When the Battle of Fredericksburg was imminent in December 1862, Miss Washington wanted to escape with her father to a place of safety quickly, but was delayed one full day because a wounded federal officer was brought to her door and placed in her care while he waited for a surgeon. The battle had begun by the time she was ready to flee and she and her father were caught on the battlefield. She found shelter for both of them in a small trench left by a cannon. They were forced to remain in that spot for a whole day and witnessed the entire battle from that position. It is said that Miss Washington's experiences that day inspired in her a will to assist women from both the North and the South in the worthy cause of preserving their shared heritage and that this was her purpose in helping to found the NSDAR.

At the close of the war, Miss Washington was offered a government position with the post office department, and so she and her father moved to Washington, DC. Known fondly as "Miss Eugie," she was considered quite attractive and always received a great deal of attention wherever she went. Eugenia Washington died at her home in Washington on Thanksgiving Day, November 30, 1900.

President General's Message



As we prepare to pause for our nationwide holiday of Thanksgiving to count our many blessings, I ask you to think back to the first moment you knew that you were eligible to join the DAR. It felt pretty special, didn't it? Knowing that you were descended from someone who sacrificed to create our nation? Feeling that joyful obligation to celebrate the institutions of democracy because you realized that you were the living beneficiary of the Patriots' combined courage and collective wisdom?

Now, I ask you to help more women discover those emotions of pride, responsibility and excitement over a personal connection to the founding of America. There has never been a more important time to be a part of our premier service organization—but we need your help to welcome more women to our timelessly relevant mission.

Let me be clear: We should not grow solely for the purpose of growth; we must grow because our mission is more vital now than ever. America needs us!

Our work to assist students, celebrate history, honor those who wear (or have worn) the uniform of our nation, welcome new citizens, conserve natural resources and complete myriad other good deeds has never been more necessary. We are the living promise of America from its founding to its future, and we need to attract more women in order to make sure that our meaningful work will continue for generations to come.

As we joyfully celebrate acceptance of our [millionth member](#), we have set ambitious goals to reach toward 200,000 members by the end of this administration, compared to today's approximate total of 186,000 women. And so I ask all chapters to strive for a 10-percent net increase year-over-year in order to increase our national membership. Chapters large and small prove this can be done—and I hope that you have appointed and empowered a membership team to identify, approach and assist Prospective members in your community. They are out there—and they will join if you extend a warm welcome and demonstrate the value of membership.





The deadline for your deposit to ride the Virginia bus to Continental Congress 2020 has been extended and the hotel block is now open!!! (If you need a room with a King bed instead of the 2 beds, please let me know so that we can work with the hotel to make this happen!)

Please consider joining us as we help Virginia DAR “shine” even brighter by attending Continental Congress 2020. It is a great time to visit our wonderful buildings, tour the museum and period rooms, do a little research in the DAR Library or Seimes Technology Center and get to know other Daughters from all over the country. And don’t forget the Virginia Luncheon!

The deposit of \$150.00 is required to hold your spot on the bus, so don’t delay! The more riders, the less each person pays so be sure and talk to your chapter members and friends about riding the bus.

The Holiday Inn Central/White House has a “block” of rooms set aside for the Virginia Daughters. Each room offers a microwave and mini-fridge for your convenience. The rate is \$252.89 (includes taxes) per night, per room, up to 4 people per room. You may make your reservation by calling the hotel directly at the number provided or by utilizing the link (detailed instructions included) in the attachment.

The Virginia Bus will be leaving on Tuesday, June 23, 2020 and returning after the Memorial Service on Sunday, June 28, 2020. Rooms are “blocked” at the hotel where the bus will park. The bus taxis members to and from the Hall throughout the week, the Virginia Luncheon on Thursday, and the Hyatt on Friday night. Our pickup locations will be Richmond, Roanoke, and Staunton. I am sorry but I am unable to add Fredericksburg this year.





Once the link opens, click "BOOK NOW", you will need to select the date of June 23, 2020 for your check-in and June 28, 2020 for your check out. Also, select the number of guests in your room.


Be sure and click the link (see the blue arrow). A code of numbers will appear in the center box (99801505), in the right hand box, you will see VDA.




Once you click the link, your screen should look like this. Notice the code numbers & letters are visible (see red circle) It is important that you **DO NOT** alter any of this!



Once you see the screen above, click "Check Availability" in the green box to the right. (see blue arrow)



This screen will appear. You will want to click "Select Room" in the Green box. (see blue arrow)



Once you click that, a new screen will appear. Please make sure that the rate says \$220 to ensure you are getting the special rate for the Virginia Continental Congress Bus Tour. Then click "Select Rate" in the Green box. (see blue arrow) The next screen will give you the opportunity to add your information, your guest and your credit card to hold the room. You will also see your total charges for the room to the far right.
